I am the sole owner of Thor's Forest Management and as you are aware I have been hired by Mr. Lepka of WL 657 to bring into compliance the woodlot in so far as RESULTS reporting. The woodlot has been in place since 1988 and has a colorful record in this matter particularly when you compare the older blocks with the newer ones. The older cutting permits were to have been entered into RESULTS by the Ministry after having received the old paper annual reports. In this District this has seldom occurred , I should know as I was the Woodlot Technician for 15 years here in Fort St James.


This does not relieve or obviate Mr. Lepka of his obligations but it must be understood that the entry of accurate data into RESULTS is at the very least a sadly shared failure. Nonetheless Mr. Lepka has accepted the fact that he is well behind in these obligations and over the course of this summer we have worked to bring the silviculture records up to date.

I have completed data entry with what I believe to be the priority items as follows...

1. I have completed the GPS'ing of the most recent block shapes (C.P.'s EE, FF) and have entered those blocks into RESULTS.(denudation and forest cover screens)
2. I have collected all the various shapes of over ten years of salvage logging under the Z & Y cutting permits and have entered them into RESULTS.(same as above)
3. The above data entry has given us a list of due dates for SR surveys some of which are overdue and thus are scheduled for next summer.
4. This data entry has also given the Licensee a schedule of survey work to be performed over the next few years .

Overall the condition of the woodlot looks entirely different in the fall of 2012 and I can report that all harvesting done on the woodlot over the last 10 years is fully reported. The surveys that will be completed in the near future will bring the older cutting permits into a compliant status. The survey results will also allow Mr. Lepka to plan for any activities that may be required such as fill planting or brushing to keep these blocks healthy and moving toward free to grow.
