2015 Benchmark Survey








What region of the province do you live in?






What is your principle area of interest as it relates to BC's forest and range practices?









How important is the Board's "independent watchdog" function for ensuring sound forest and range practices in BC?






In a word (or several words) what comes to mind when you think of the Forest Practices Board?








In executing its mandate, how does the Forest Practices Board **perform** against each of the same seven criteria?








