Dear Gun Lake and Gold Bridge communities,

Re: Sharing information about a new complaint investigation - Downton Lake wildfire control

The Forest Practices Board wants to inform the Gun Lake and Gold Bridge communities of a complaint investigation we are undertaking in your community.

The Forest Practices Board is B.C.'s independent watchdog for sound forest and range practices, reporting its findings and recommendations directly to the public and government. The Board investigates public complaints about forest and range practices on public lands and the appropriateness of government enforcement. It can also make recommendations for improvement to practices and legislation.

This complaint investigation is about BC Wildfire Service's use of planned ignitions on the Downton Lake wildfire in August 2023. The complainants, three Gun Lake residents, believe the planned ignitions were inappropriate considering the circumstances and led to the destruction of more than 40 homes on the west side of Gun Lake.
